

#### REMOVAL OF EXISTING DOORS AND WINDOWS



Our fitting team will normally arrive on site by 10am unless we have made other arrangements with you, and they can give you a call on the way if requested.

We will first prepare the work areas and lay down dust sheets where necessary to cut down on mess and cleaning afterwards.

It is always helpful if you can move any furniture or obstacles away from these areas before our arrival and also clear access for our large van where possible.

We will then remove the old doors and windows causing as little damage and disruption as possible.

As every installation is different it is often difficult to anticipate what will happen when old doors and windows are removed, and sometimes extra work is required such as pointing brickwork, minor plastering and painting etc. We can quote and arrange these additional works or simply advise you on what will need to be done. As experienced installers we will have a good idea of what will be required following our site survey and can therefore do our best to predict and include any additional work in our quotation so there are no surprises.

Next, we prepare the openings and install the new doors and windows using secure fixings.

We then check that everything is operating correctly by opening and closing the doors and windows plus making sure they lock properly.

We will then seal around the edges and make sure everything is weather tight.

Then we give everything a good clean up and remove any rubbish.

Basic making good is included in our standard installation cost and this includes touching up any paintwork on doors, windows and frames that we have installed. Sometimes it is necessary for us to re-visit a few days later to make any minor adjustments once the new doors and windows have settled in but this is all part of the service.

Please note that painting internal walls and window boards isn't included as standard but we can quote for this to be done upon request.
